The EFFORTS project has shown that the digitization of EU enforcement proceedings ensures a better circulation of judicial decisions between the EU Member States. It allows more expeditious enforcement and, therefore, better access to justice. At this Conference, the DIgitalization and aCCEss to justice (DIKE) Research Unit will compare the results of the EFFORTS project with other experiences in the field of digitization.
